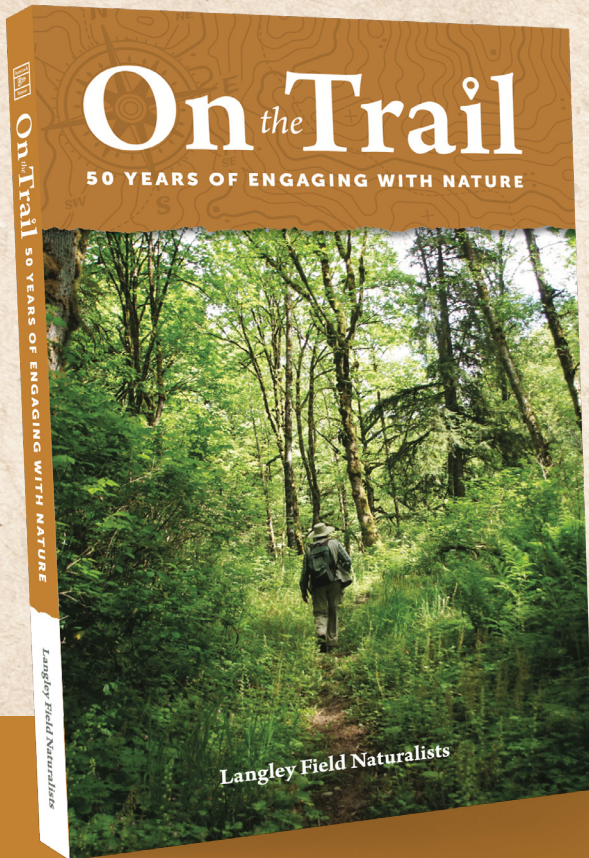


On the Trail
